Comments by Coach Eller: "The final score isn't an indication of how even the game was. We made 2 big mistakes that led to 2 of Glenwood's goals. Offensively, we kept the ball on 1 side of the field too often, which led to steals and counters. All 3 of Glenwood's goals were on counters. We possessed the ball better than we have against Glenwood in my 4 years coaching the girls, and we created some really good shots. Unfortunately, none of the shots went in. Glenwood's defense, especially their sweeper, is very fast and we weren't able to get through balls anywhere close to the middle of the field as their sweeper cleaned all of them up. We didn't do a good enough job of switching fields or using swing passes to get the ball side to side against their diamond defense. Defensively, our first goal we gave up, we tried to do too much. We were in good position against their long ball over the top, but we tried to turn with the ball instead of dropping to our goalkeeper. The ball was stolen from our defender, leaving a 1 on 1 with our keeper that they finished from 10 yards out. Their 2nd goal was a counter following us playing a long ball over the top that went right to their goalkeeper. The opportunity for a switch was there, but again we kept the ball on one side of the field. Their keeper started a counter down the right sideline ending with a perfectly placed pass leading to a tough 15 yard shot on the right wing. Their 3rd goal, we had the ball in their defensive third but kept the ball on the right side of the field for a possession when a swing to the left would have created a 1 on 1 chance. Glenwood got a steal and quickly countered down the right sideline. They centered a pass that Sam slid to grab like she has done several times every game. Sam wasn't able to squeeze the ball and it bounced off of her to our defender's arm. It was my opinion that a handball should not have been called as that was ball to hand and our defender wasn't sticking her arm out to stop the ball. But, my opinion wasn't the one that counted and I lost my argument to the official. They were awarded a PK and finished the shot for the 3-0 final margin. Glenwood was faster than we are, they were tougher than we are and they played a more physical style of soccer than any team we have played against this season. It was a good learning experience if we see another team this season that plays a physical style of soccer. We will have to adjust and play to the level of physicality that the officials will allow".
